Purpose of the Finance and Budget Committee

The Board of the Federation of British Artists ('Federation') has established the Finance and Budget Committee to advise the Board in relation to the financial affairs and the risk analysis of the Federation. The Committee receives its delegated authority under Article 48 of the FBA's Articles of Association. The committee is chaired by Martin Anderson, and it is comprised of 2 treasurers from the member art societies, 2 trustees and 2 independents

The committee meets quarterly one-two weeks before the FBA Board meeting. The Chairman reports to the FBA Board on the financial position of the organisation.
